Focus on definition:

“Open Educational Resources are **teaching, learning and research** materials in **any medium – digital or otherwise** – that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions.” (Hewelett Foundation 2019)

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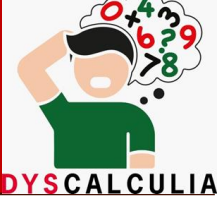

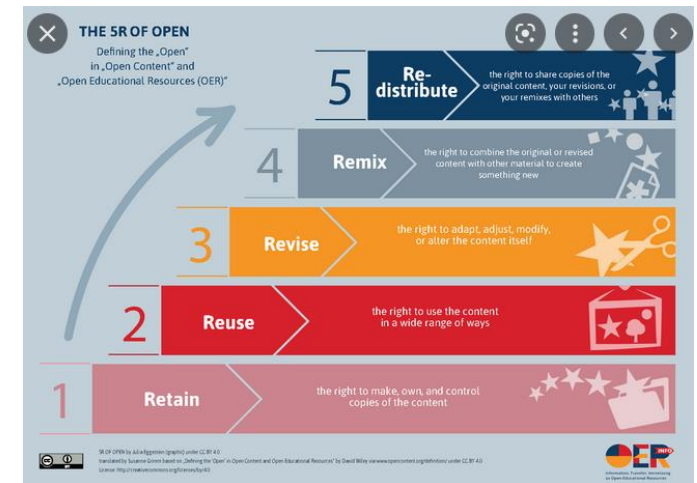

RETAIN -

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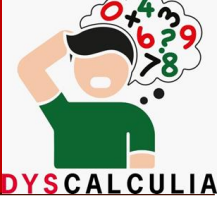
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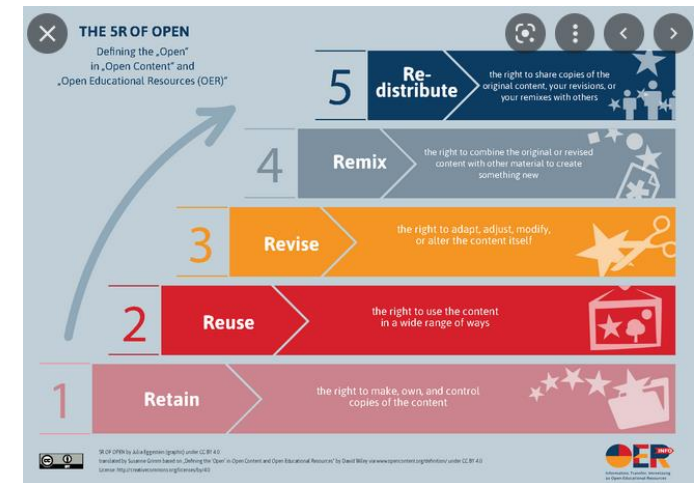


What makes a resource open?



REUSE-

the right to use the content in a wide range of ways (e.g., in a class, in a study group, on a website, in a video)



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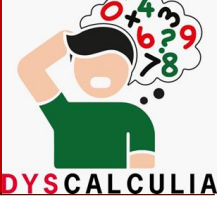
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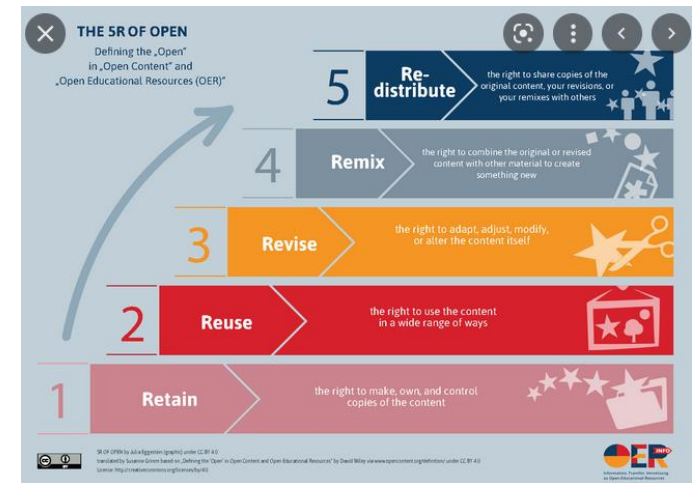


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REVISE-

the right to adapt, adjust, modify, or alter the content itself (e.g., translate the content into another language)



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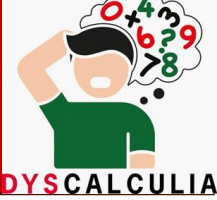
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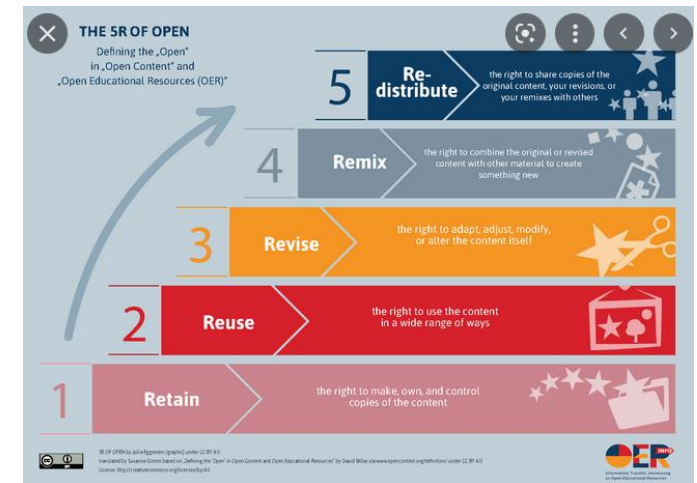


What makes a resource open?



REMIX-

the right to combine the original or revised content with other material to create something new (e.g., incorporate the content into a mashup)



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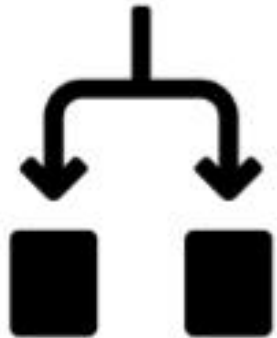
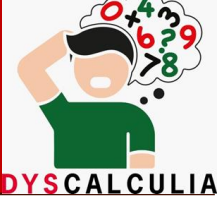
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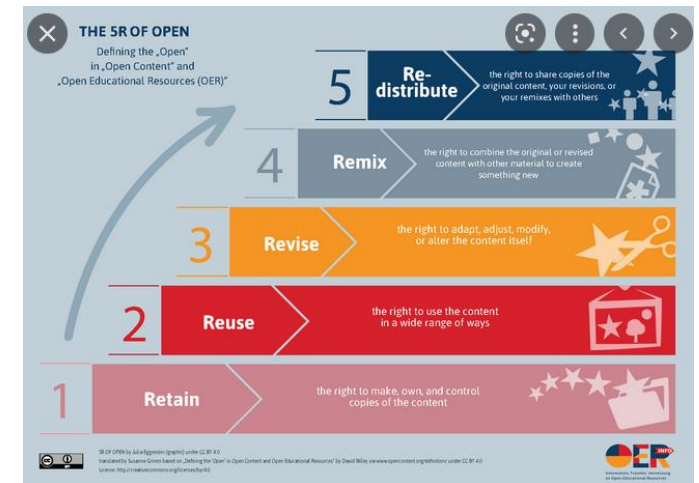


What makes a resource open?



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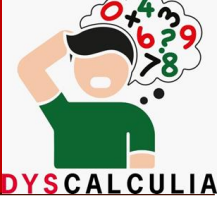
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3. **Revise** - the right to adapt, adjust, modify, or alter the content itself (e.g., translate the content into another language)
4. **Remix** - the right to combine the original or revised content with other material to create something new (e.g., incorporate the content into a mashup)
5. **Redistribute** - the right to share copies of the original content, your revisions, or your remixes with others (e.g., give a copy of the content to a friend)

The 5R Permissions of OER

Retain	• Make and own copies
Reuse	• Use in a wide range of ways
Revise	• Adapt, modify, and improve
Remix	• Combine two or more
Redistribute	• Share with others

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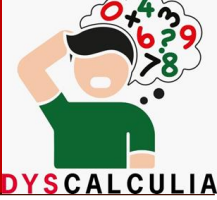
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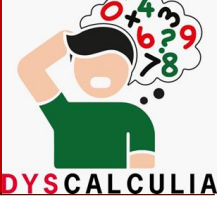
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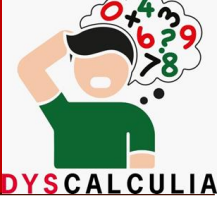
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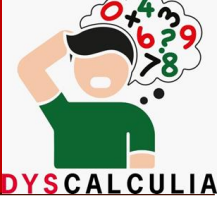
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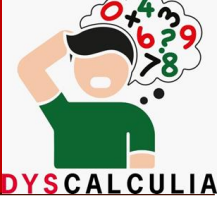

Essential Steps for Creating Compelling Videos: From Planning to Publication

Preparation and Planning: Idea, Script, Storyboard, and Selection of Filming, Music/ Audio, Locations and Actors.

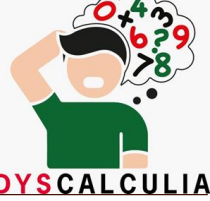
Production: Use of Film and Audio Equipment, Recording of Scenes and Dialogues.

Post-production: Editing of Recordings, Adding Graphics, Music, and Effects, Color Correction, and Audio Post-production.

Publication: Exporting the Finished Video and Publishing on Suitable Platform

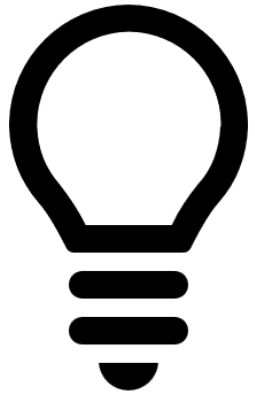
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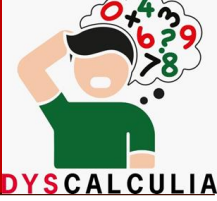


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
