

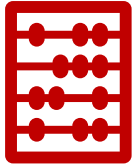


Change Your Perspective: It's Just Dyscalculia

Dyscalculia is a pronounced impairment of mathematical thinking or calculation skills.



The objectives of the project are:

1. Project activities contribute to increasing the institutional capacity of the project partner organisations, particularly in the area of school education and dealing with dyscalculia.
2. It is ensured that pupils with learning difficulties are included in mainstream education.
3. The professional skills of the trainers in the project partner organisations will be strengthened at EU level.
4. With regard to European standards, the project partner organisations will ensure that development plans for dyscalculia are designed and created.
